Title	<u>Challenges of Urbanisation: Inequalities in Bangalore</u>
Description	Case study video with student activities and teacher guidance materials. Recommended by Cambridge International Examinations. DUR: 27 mins. YEAR: 2009. Taking Bangalore as a case study, this video looks at the causes of urban poverty, including urbanisation and push pull factors of rural to urban migration. The programme provides visual examples of poverty indicators, including: poor housing, sanitation, lack of access to public transport, education, water etc. The programme then visits various poverty alleviation projects covering: sanitation and clean water, housing and overcoming caste prejudice.

Title	<u>Flooding in Bangladesh: Causes, Impacts and Management</u>
Description	Case study video with student activities and teacher guidance materials. Recommended by Cambridge International Examinations. DUR: 38 mins. YEAR: 2010. This resource explores the physical and human causes of flooding in Bangladesh, including climate change. It then explores the social, economic and environmental impacts of this flooding through the personal accounts of people living by the major rivers and on Bangladesh's char lands. It then provides examples of a variety of flood management strategies, and discusses the pros and cons of hard and soft engineering. It also shows how NGOs are working with flood affected communities to alleviate poverty and reduce their vulnerability to future floods.

Title	<u>Holderness: Sustainable Coastal Management</u>
Description	Case study video with student activities and teacher guidance materials. Recommended by Cambridge International Examinations. YEAR: 2008. KS 3-5. Taking the stretch of UK coastline, this resource looks at the causes, effects and management of coastal erosion. It shows the different landforms created along the coast, the issues they create and the different ways in which they are managed, including hard and soft engineering. It then goes on to evaluate the impact of different management techniques and explores the concept of physical interdependence of environments.

Title	<u>Montserrat: Living with Volcanoes</u>
Description	Case study video with student activities and teacher guidance materials. Recommended by Cambridge International Examinations. Year: 2013. A perfect case study of a volcano in an LEDC. The resource provides a clear explanation of the processes causing Montserrat's recent volcanic activity. It then assesses the social, economic and environmental impacts of the continuing eruptions. The likelihood of Montserrat becoming self-sufficient is explored with sections looking at: the potential of Montserrat's tourist industry; strategies for disaster response and preparedness; and projects to improve biodiversity.

Description	Case study video with student activities and teacher guidance materials. Recommended by Cambridge International Examinations. Dur: 31 minutes / Year: 2013. High quality video footage including examples of potholes, rapids, waterfalls, gorges, meanders, braiding, flood plains and deltas. Use these case studies, along with the detailed graphics provided, to explain the fluvial processes of erosion, transportation and deposition and explore how they change throughout a river's course. The process and impact of rejuvenation is also explored through the use of specific examples.

Title	<u>The Haiti Earthquake: Impacts and Responses</u>
Description	Case study video with student activities and teacher guidance materials. Recommended by Cambridge International Examinations. Case study video with student activities and teacher guidance materials. Year: 2013. Use this resource to exemplify the effects of a geo-hazard in an LEDC. The film first sets out Haiti's historical context to explain why the impacts were so devastating. Then, using footage filmed straight after the 2010 earthquake and in the three years following, the resource explores the primary and secondary impacts of the quake. The DVD then looks at a range of short and long term responses, including projects aimed at: reducing the outbreak of cholera, improving the housing situation, strengthening livelihoods and supporting good governance.
