Before you begin teaching, check the set text list for the year in which your candidates will take their examinations.</p> <p>Changes to version 3, published March 2018</p> <p>Set texts editions</p> <p>Editions of set texts which include annotations, highlighting or notes cannot be taken into open-book examinations.
