


## Syllabus update: Cambridge O Level Literature in English (2010) for examination in 2019

We have updated this syllabus. The latest syllabus is version 3, published September 2018.

 <p><b>Changes to syllabus</b></p>	<p><b>A statement has been added about the rotation of set texts.</b></p> <p>Set texts regularly rotate on the syllabus and may change from one year of examination to the next. Before you begin teaching, check the set text list for the year in which your candidates will take their examinations.</p> <p><b>Changes to version 2, published June 2018</b></p> <p><b>Component 1: Selection of short stories for examination in 2019 only</b></p> <p>The following 10 stories from <i>Stories of Ourselves: The University of Cambridge International Examinations Anthology of Short Stories in English</i> (Cambridge University Press) are the selection for the examination in <b>2019 only</b>.
