



US Course Credit Policy Checklist and Considerations

When creating a Cambridge policy, assemble a team or task force to evaluate and make initial recommendations, or use an existing committee if such exists. This team would include representation from both academic and student affairs/enrollment departments

➤ Discuss your goals in creating Cambridge policies (could be any or all of the below)

- Identify/recruit new population of students
- Provide more options for advanced coursework recognition
- Establish parity with peer institutions

➤ Consider your existing policies for advanced placement courses and exams:

- How will a Cambridge policy align?
- Should Cambridge be added to scholarship opportunities?
- Can Cambridge grades satisfy English proficiency requirements for international students?

➤ Set a timeline for the review process

➤ Connect with your Cambridge Regional Manager to arrange a presentation or get additional information

➤ Review Cambridge course and exam resources:

➤ Consider policy questions:

- Will one minimum grade be used across all programs or will each department set a minimum?
- Can students earn more credit for higher scores on Cambridge International AS & A Levels?
- Will you emphasize general education or major courses vs. elective credits?
- Will credits extend to all students (major vs non-major)?
- Will you establish limitations on the number of credits earned across all sources (AP, IB, Cambridge, etc.)?

- **Identify/crosswalk exams to equivalent courses and publish policies on your website**
- **Register your policy with Cambridge**
- **Establish a review cycle for policy/determine data collection and analysis needs**
