

Elite's Early College Magnet Program

- Honors courses and high school courses in middle school.
- Advanced Placement courses and Cambridge International courses in high school for college credits.
- 27 Carnegie Units required for Graduation, more than the traditional high school.
 - Four years of foreign language is required, including one year of Latin.
- Dual enrollment is an option for 11th/12th graders.



- Discovered the Cambridge International program through visits to other magnet schools.
- Being a school with a gifted population of 50%, we wanted an innovative approach to sustaining our student's interest.
- Cambridge International is the largest provider of international education for 3-19 year olds.

Cambridge offers a flexible curriculum that can be tailored to local contexts.





- Much more likely to graduate college and finish their degrees on time.




Research findings into college success with Cambridge

Studies show that Cambridge International Education qualifications are excellent preparation for students heading to the US.

Students with Cambridge qualifications are much more likely to enrol in college straight after finishing school than those with other qualifications.






Cambridge qualifications improve the chances of a student staying on at university. Cambridge students were more likely than International Baccalaurate (IB) students to continue their studies and not to drop out.

Students with Cambridge International Education qualifications are more likely to graduate than students with other qualifications, and to finish their degrees on time.



- Curriculum: The flexibility of the curriculum allows me to find contemporary topics that interest students while broadening their knowledge, understanding and perspectives of the world.


