How can I review Unit 1 & 2 coursebooks?

You can review the published Unit 1 & 2 digital coursebooks with embedded activities through a 30-day free trial. This trial is self-serve, open to all teachers, and does not include the assignable language activities. Here is how to get access:

3. Select 'Find and trial resources'.
4. Search for 'North American Cambridge Latin Course 6th edition' and activate the trial.

Teaching Support

When will the Teacher's Manuals be available?

The Teacher's Manual for Units 1 and 2 are available now through the digital teacher's resource on the Cambridge GO platform.

What is in the Teacher's Manual?

The Teacher's Manual, available as a downloadable PDF, includes guidance on using the CLC, and teaching notes for every Stage, with support for teaching language and cultural background. The Teacher's Manual has been thoroughly revised and updated with consideration of approaches to sensitive content.

Is the Teacher's Manual available in print?

No, our teacher's manuals are downloadable PDFs available through the digital teacher's resource on the Cambridge GO platform.

What other teaching support is available?

- Worksheets
- Assessments (three per unit covering content from a range of stages)
- Alignment to the NLE.

Digital resources

What is in the Unit 1, 2 and 3 digital resources?

The digital resources for teachers, available through the Cambridge GO platform consist of:

- Digital coursebook (teacher version of the student digital coursebook) including Explore the story, with audio embedded
- Digital activities you can assign to students, with reporting (Vocabulary, Reviewing the Language and sorting activities can be assigned by teachers to their classes. With the flexibility to set end dates or manually close assessments, teachers can control when the activities are taken.)
- Teacher's Manual (downloadable PDF)
- Downloadable worksheets and tests.

What's the difference between Cambridge Elevate and Cambridge GO?

'Cambridge Elevate' and 'Cambridge GO' are both online platforms for accessing Latin digital resources. The majority of teachers are using 'Cambridge GO', which is our new platform, but if you have a long license term for your Cambridge Latin digital resources, you may still be using 'Elevate'.

The NACLCLC 6th edition only delivers digital resources on 'Cambridge GO'. The way content is delivered is very similar to 'Elevate', but 'Cambridge GO' has updated tools, accessibility updates, and the ability to set up institutions and classes for assigning content.
