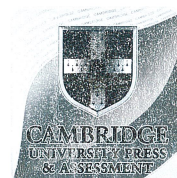

## INTERNATIONAL GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF SECONDARY EDUCATION (IGCSE)

IGCSE grades A\*(a\*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), F(f) or G(g) indicate the standard reached, grade A\*(a\*) being the highest and grade G(g) the lowest. Performances below the standard of grade G(g) are not reported on certificates.

Candidates awarded grades A\*(a\*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), F(f) or G(g) have reached standards at least equivalent to the same grades in the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE). Candidates awarded A\*(a\*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d) or E(e) have reached standards at least equivalent to the same grades in the General Certificate of Education Ordinary Level (GCE O Level).

Certain language syllabuses contain oral/aural tests which are separately endorsed. Where the candidate has passed such an oral/aural test this is reported on the certificate by grades 1(ONE) high to 5(FIVE) low.

English as a Second Language contains a Speaking test which is separately endorsed, this is reported on the certificate by grades 1(ONE) high to 5(FIVE) low.
