3. On CD2, find the tracks containing the chosen Set Work for your candidates. Play CD2, Set Work.
For candidates answering questions on Rodrigo: *Concierto de Aranjuez* play **tracks 1–8**.
For candidates answering questions on Mendelssohn: *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Overture Op. 21 play **track 1 and then tracks 9–16**.
4. At the end of Section D, you will hear 'you now have 8 minutes to complete and check your answers in this section'.
5. After the 8 minute pause (which is recorded on the CD), collect in the candidates' question papers.
